**Cognitive Aging: Can we modify risk of cognitive decline in late life? - Michael Keys, M.D.,** *Lindner Center of HOPE, Senior Adult Psychiatrist and Adjunct Associate Professor of Psychiatry*

At the end of this presentation, the participant will be able to:

1. Describe the continuum from normal aging and cognitive status to the development of decline in cognitive and functional abilities as seen in late-onset Alzheimer's disease.
2. Identify what has been learned in terms of prevalence of dementia in late life that suggest risk of developing the illness may be declining in developed nations and discussion of hypothesis of why that may be.
3. Discuss the complex interplay and what is known of risk and protective factors.

1. Describe the principles of narrative medicine and identify how this knowledge can improve patient interactions.
2. Explain how to create a narrative medicine exercise.

**Psychotropic Medications in Patients with Advanced Kidney Disease - Ritchie Chiu, M.D.,** *Nephrologist*

At the end of this presentation, the participant will be able to:

1. Define chronic kidney disease (CKD) in an effort to provide basic understanding about psychotropic dosage adjustments.
2. Explain basic alterations of drug metabolism in advanced CKD patients.
3. Explain general principles of managing choice and dosing of psychotropic medications in advanced CKD patients.

**Introduction to Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (TMS) - Jonathan Cole, D.O.,** *Lindner Center of HOPE, Adult Psychiatrist*

At the end of this presentation, the participant will be able to:

1. Describe the scientific basis and history of magnetic therapy.
2. Explain what the process of transcranial magnetic stimulation is for a patient, including indications, contraindications, side-effects and tolerability.
3. Identify future applications of TMS currently being researched in psychiatry.
